Ask Carl

- Q: With the new Rules for2019 I heard that I can ground my club in hazards. Is that correct?
- A: Well technically there is no such thing as a hazard. What used to be called water hazards are now called penalty areas. In a penalty area it is permissible to ground your club. You might be thinking what about sand traps? These are defined in the rules as Bunkers (Rule 12). In a bunker you are still not allowed to ground your club. You can make incidental contact though.
- Q: On holes #10 and #11, there are a bunch of solar panels and lights. How do I play them if my ball becomes blocked by them or my stance is hindered by them?
- A: These would be classified as movable obstructions. If you find your ball lying close to or against a movable obstruction, you may remove the obstruction under Rule 24-1a. If your ball moves as you do this, you may replace it without penalty, providing the movement of the ball is directly attributable to the removal of the obstruction. Make sure to move the lights and/or solar panels back.

REMINDER: 2019 CEO Cup Registration Closes February 17th

Dear 2019 CEO Cup invitees,

The 2019 CEO Cup is scheduled to be played on February $22^{nd} - 23^{rd}$ at the Rolling Hills Golf Course.

The event is open for registration via Tournament Management (for RHGC Members). If you are not a member of RHGC, you may register through your respective Saudi Aramco Golf Association (SAGA)-affiliated club President.. If you wish to participate, please make timely registration a priority as the **registration deadline of February 17th** is fast approaching.

Please note the following <u>new information</u> regarding the tournament and awards dinner, which will be held following Saturday's play at the Plaza Conference Center starting at 4 p.m.

- Saudi Aramco's CEO graciously provided funding for an enhanced CEO Cup this year including a very generous set of goodie bag giveaways.
- Full breakfasts consisting of French toast, egg omelet, sausage, and some fruit will be available Friday and Saturday morning for the players and tournament volunteers.
- Safwa's famous, freshly made shawarmas will be available for the players and volunteers on Friday starting at 11:00 a.m. Lunch is not provided on Saturday but food may be purchased as usual from the RHGC clubhouse.
- Water and other drinks will be available throughout the tournament. Please be courteous to your fellow players and limit the drinks that you consume to the maximums that will be described on tournament day.
- The Dinner & Awards Banquet check-in commences at the Plaza Conference Center at 4:00 p.m. with the reception beginning at 4:30 p.m.
- Parking for private cars will be available at the Plaza Conference Center. No bus transport will be provided.
- Attendance at the Dinner & Awards Banquet is mandatory for the winners in any category
 or closest to the Pin competition. Should any winners fail to attend the Dinner & Awards
 Banquet without an excuse acceptable to the Tournament Committee, they will be disqualified as
 the winner in said category and playing privileges at their home club will be suspended for one
 month.
- This year's Dinner & Awards Banquet will include raffle drawings at the conclusion of the formal program. Prizes (subject to change) will include golf lessons, golf equipment and other golf paraphernalia. You must be present at the Dinner & Awards Banquet in order to win.

Other items of note regarding the tournament and the awards dinner:

- Only members in good standing with RHGC, or your affiliated SAGA, are eligible to participate in the tournament. If you do not possess a valid 2019 membership and a verifiable handicap, you cannot participate. Please do not register for the tournament if these two conditions have not been met. Not meeting these requirements will result in disqualification, as determined by the Tournament Committee.
- Saudi Aramco's CEO has communicated to the committee that he has an expectation for the tournament participants to attend the Dinner & Awards Banquet. Please show your appreciation of the CEO's commitment to Saudi Aramco golfing experience and tournament by attending the Dinner & Awards Banquet.
- If a player plans on attending the February 23rd Dinner & Awards Banquet, you must purchase a ticket which are available at the RHGC Pro Shop starting January 21st. The cost of a ticket is 150 SAR, which is refundable to each participant player at the Dinner & Awards Banquet check-in upon presentation of the dinner ticket.
- If a player plans to bring a guest to the awards dinner, a ticket must also be purchased for your guest at the RHGC Pro Shop. The cost of a guest ticket is 150 SAR and is nonrefundable.
- Players from SAGA affiliated clubs (non-RHGC members) must indicate their intentions
 to attend the awards dinner event (including a guest, if applicable) at the time that their
 club President or Representative submits its player registrations to the 2019 CEO Cup
 Tournament Director. Tickets will be made available to these players on Friday, February
 22nd, at the RHGC Pro Shop, after payment has been made.
- Dinner & Awards Banquet Ticket sales commence January 21st and will close February 17th at 7 p.m.
- Only visiting SAGA players who have indicated their intentions to attend the awards dinner, but have not made purchase of tickets before February 17th, may pick up/purchase their tickets Friday, February 22nd.

Handicap Corner

Please contact the Handicap Director (handicaps@arabiangolf.net) if you have any questions.

The HC Committee would like to thank all those that have already competed the HC Quiz (over 200 members so far) and remind everyone that if you want to play in tournaments you must complete the quiz.

Also as we begin a new year, a quick reminder to please post ALL acceptable scores to GHIN (as soon as possible after the round).

Acceptability of Scores

Fair handicapping depends upon full and accurate information regarding a player's potential scoring ability as reflected by a complete scoring record. Every player must be responsible for returning all acceptable scores, as defined in this section. For handicap purposes, all Section 4 adjustments, including Equitable Stroke Control, must be applied to all scores, including tournament scores

- Q. What scores are acceptable for handicap posting purposes?
- **A**. Almost all scores are acceptable because of the basic premise of the USGA Handicap System which states that every player will try to make the best score at each hole in every round, regardless of where the round is played, and that the player will post every acceptable round for peer review. Therefore, all of the following are acceptable scores:
- Any round in which at least 13 holes are played should be posted as an 18-hole round for handicap purposes. Rounds of at least 7, but less than 13 holes played, should be posted as a 9-hole round. Un-played holes are entered as par plus any handicap strokes (i.e. net par).
- Scores on all courses with a valid Course Rating and Slope Rating
- Scores in all forms of competition: match play, stroke play, and team competitions where each player play their own ball.
- Scores made under The Rules of Golf including scores played under the local rule of "preferred lies"
- Unfinished Holes and Conceded Strokes A player who starts, but does not complete a hole or is conceded a stroke must record for handicap purposes the most likely score. The most likely score may not exceed the player's Equitable Stroke Control limit.
- Holes Not Played or Not Played Under The Rules of Golf If a player does not play a hole or plays it other than under the Rules of Golf (except for preferred lies), the score recorded for that hole for handicap purposes must be par plus any handicap strokes the player is entitled to receive on that hole. (ie.net par)
- Equitable Stroke Control All scores for handicap purposes, including tournament scores, are subject to the application of Equitable Stroke Control (ESC). This mandatory procedure reduces high hole scores for handicap purposes in order to make handicaps more representative of a player's potential ability.

EQUITABLE STROKE CONTROL

COURSE HANDICAP	MAXIMUM SCORE ON ANY HOLE
9 or less	Double Bogey
10 through 19	7
20 through 29	8
30 through 39	9
40 or more	10

Q. What scores are NOT acceptable for handicap purposes?

- When fewer than seven holes are played
- When made on a golf course in an area in which an inactive season is in effect
- When, as a condition of the competition, the maximum number of clubs allowed is less than 14, or types of clubs are limited as, for example, in a competition that allows only iron clubs
- When scores are made on a course with no USGA Course Rating or Slope Rating
- When a player uses non-conforming clubs, non-conforming balls, or non-conforming tees; or when a player incurs a second breach
 of Rule 14-3
- When a player plays alone, however, anyone accompanying a golfer during a round, including a caddie, would make the score acceptable.
- When a player ignores one or more Rules of Golf and fails to post an adjusted hole score as required under Section 4-1 and 4-2, or fails to record the appropriate penalty for a breach of rule

Grounds Update

The Tamarisk removal is slowing moving forward and changes similar to hole #8 are quite dramatic. Please continue to show patience as we transition Rolling Hills back to the original course design. Jason Sexton (Superintendent), Maintenance Crew, Gardening, Recreation and Aramco Management are all on board as we strive to make Rolling Hills even more remarkable than what you see today.

Near-term Activity Pipeline

- Tamarisk removal ongoing
- Gardening continuing to plant ornamental trees as part of beautification
- Adopt-A-Hole continues moving forward; Barry Wethington will take organizational lead
- Jason agrees with the Board that a sharp demarcation between rough and desert is needed
- Plan to test marl, or coquina, mixed with clay for transition outside of rough; this will help
 prevent shrub growth and will be firm enough for carts to drive on and players making
 shots without tire ruts; something similar to Riffa or the Els Dubai courses
- Driving range grass to be leveled out
- Tee boxes leveled out
- Cart path bumps leveled out
- Contract approved for complete overhaul of machinery; commitment is to best in class brands and lots of new equipment to help with maintenance and enhancement
- Fairways reclaimed from rough creep
- Reshape bailout areas for many holes
- Rough needs major attention to improve playability
